Arising	2.1 Recreation Update	Kim MacDonald provided a written response to a document prepared by Family Council and previously sent to her (Dec. 2022), which had identified several observations and questions related to recreation for residents. Family Council appreciated the written feedback from Kim and continued the discussion by exploring areas for improvement/ challenges faced / or ways in which we can provide support. Family council raised the following points: • the recreational event calendar lacks detail and is difficult to interpret a more 'user friendly' approach would help family members better understand what activities are occurring. • seek clarification on what "neighborhood time" entails. • for all recreational activities - suggest naming the specific activity that is scheduled along with the location. • question the possibility of having an in-house adult day program for residents within the RK • see merit in hosting activities both in individual resident care areas and also in open areas, thereby allowing residents an opportunity to leave their own unit. • suggest placement of a white board at the facility entrance, to provide detailed information of what activity is happening each day and the location.
